GRADING REQUIREMENTS

Each student must return their application with a \$35 non-refundable application fee. All students must attend the Kingdom Launch: New Student Orientation. Each student will be given a study Bible at the beginning of their first year and a new binder containing the courses. Study assignments will be assigned weekly, from the Bible. It serves as the textbook for the entire two year process. Each student is required to carry a 2.75 or above GPA (See grading scale below). This grade is determined by the following criteria:

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS: FIRST YEAR

First year classes are designed to help build biblical foundation upon which effective ministry can be built.

101 | Bible Study Methods: This course teaching the students several approaches to studying the Bible with an aim of helping them organize the material for teaching or preaching

102 | **Old Testament Survey:** This course examines the divisions of the Old Testament with an overview of its 39 books set within the culture and history of Israel as a people and nation.

103 | **New Testament Survey:** This course examines the divisions of the New Testament books with an emphasis on the history of the church from its conception through the First Century.

104 | **The Kingdom of God:** This course examines the development of the Kingdom of God on earth from the Garden of Eden to the Millennial Reign of Christ. Its emphasis is on proper church order today personally and corporately.

105 | **Bible Covenants:** This course studies the nine covenants that God has made for the benefit of mankind with respect to His divine plan of redemption and how it relates to the believer's personal relationship with God.

106 | Tabernacles and Temples: This course examines the tabernacles and temples of the Bible in order to see salvation's plan displayed in each and how it relates to us today.

107 | Biblical Theology: This course is designed to build a simple, yet secure foundation of Biblical doctrine under the student's life and ministry. No far out doctrines here, just the basics that most every major church and denomination can agree upon.

108 | Church History: This course follows the development of the church from the close of the First Century until now, with an emphasis on how NOT to repeat the mistakes of our forefathers.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS: SECOND YEAR

Second year classes are designed to provide the practical skills needed to help create a true servant of God.

- **201 | Spiritual Gifts:** This course is one of the most practical courses offered. It gives the person confidence that God has, indeed, blessed them with gifts and abilities that can, and should, help the Body of Christ.
- **202** | **Leadership Ethics:** This course may challenge the students more than any other as we apply the moral standards of the Bible with today's crumbling ethics both within and outside the church.
- **203 | Servant Leadership:** Servant leadership is what Christ displayed with His disciples and is the basis of application for these basics leadership principles as they relate to the church.
- **204 | Dominion Leadership:** All believers are called to help pastor the flock inasmuch as God has called each of us to help nurture and raise up others around us according to the model of parenthood.
- **205** | Church Administration: This course helps lay out a strategy for administrating a church using the Book of Acts as a model for what the contemporary church should look like.
- **206 | Small Groups:** For many of our students, they may either lead a small group or start small groups. This course is a basic overview of how get the job done, working as close to the Biblical model as possible.
- **207 | Teaching and Preaching Methods:** This course builds upon the previous class by helping the student sharpen their skills in communicating effectively the Word of God in a public forum.
- **208** | **Biblical Counseling:** This class helps the student understand some foundational counseling skills that take into consideration the whole man, body soul and spirit, with respect to the regenerating power of the Holy Spirit.

POLICIES + PROCEDURES

MINISTRY HOURS

Each student is also required to have 100 hours of ministry time over the two year period at their local church under pastoral supervision. We believe that training happens as much as in the doing of ministry as it does in the learning of the ministry.

AFFILIATION

The Queen City School of Ministry is affiliated with the SOMA Network of Schools led by Pastor Mark Pfeifer.

GRADUATION

Upon completion of all requirements students will receive a Diploma of Completion through the Queen City School of Ministry. The graduation ceremony will take place in December at the end of every 2 year cycle, and will be held at Solid Rock Church South.

TUITION

The Queen City School of Ministry Tuition Plan is as follows:

Money for each course is due by the first day of class.

DISCOUNTS & INCENTIVES*

Students paying in full for the entire year receive a 10% deduction off their total tuition costs.

Married students receive a 20% discount on one tuition bill if enrolled at the same time.

GRADUATION

Outstanding balances of the tuition must be paid in full by the end of each calendar year. And all balances must be paid in full before a student receives their diploma.

All tuition fees are non-refundable and an additional 10% late fee will be assessed to each student whose tuition bill is over four weeks late.

Students who owe back tuition for more than 8 weeks will be dismissed from the school until tuition is paid in full.
